Replacement Parts: SMXII Keypads Obsolete

SMXII Keypads, p/n: 11599

We were notified by our vendor that our SMXII keypads have finally been obsoleted by our vendor due to obsolescence of component parts, primarily the plastic bezels around the keypad.

We were able to get one final batch of 23 keypads made with a machined steel bezel but due to the significant increase in cost the manufacturer won't continue to provide it beyond this. Once these are gone the only alternative for replacing these will be



a control retrofit to the B&R platform. Current pricing on the 11599 keypad is \$4,299. If you have any customers still utilizing feeds with the SMXII Reliance/Electrocraft control, please make them aware of the situation.

Job Fair: KVCC Workforce Interactive Event

Jake and Katie attended the Kennebec Valley Community College Workforce Interactive Job Fair on April 26th to reach out to local students looking into careers in fabrication.







We offered our **Formtek-Maine Machine Tool Intern Scholarship Program** to develop machinists for future employment in our manufacturing department. About 150 students from a dozen local schools attended.

High-Capacity Flexible Fabrication System for Major Water Heater Manufacturer

We recently shipped and are currently installing a new flexible fabrication system for a major water heater manufacturer in Michigan. The system can handle 30,000 lb. coils of surface-critical CRS up to 60" wide and 0.125" thick in blanks up to 84" long.

The system includes a 30,000 lb. stock reel and coil car and includes options like a spring-set safety brake, automatic brake tension control, a clock-spring guard, and automatic coil centering on the coil car via a laser sensor.





The (11) roll heavy-duty D series straightener includes chrome plated rolls, back-up flights on all work rolls, high rise upper rolls for access for cleaning, power to all straightener rolls, our powered hands-free cleaning system, and a hold-down peeler station for hands-free thread-up of coils. A set of powered pinch rolls pulls the strip through the customer's blast machine.





Our exclusive (4) roll servo feed guides the strip into our DieMation coil processor system, which includes (2) tooling stations servo controlled in both the X and Y axes and space to add more tooling stations in the future, and a scrap conveyor with scrap bin for the slugs. A second (4) roll feed is used to pull the strip through, and a hydraulic powered cutoff shear for blanking.







Parts exit the cutoff shear and drop onto a belt conveyor with a reject station that can drop parts into a scrap bin mounted under the conveyor. The direct drop stacker uses non-marking polyurethane fingers to support the parts and an air blower system for stacking light gauge materials, a scissor lift table with auto-down feature to minimize the drop distance, and end discharge conveyor with powered rollers to allow removal of stacks from either the end or the side of the conveyor





The line was installed by our Formtek-Maine Service Department, including integration with the new blast machine provided by a third party. The customer is currently awaiting start-up, training, and commissioning, scheduled for later this month.

ROWE Machinery & Manufacturing hired Hallis Juster to install a cut-to-length line at his father's service center in Minneapolis, MN where his brother Shale was the plant manager. When Bill Springs from ROWE approached him about a position as a field service technician. Hal agreed on the condition that after a year ROWE would give him the line as he had planned on starting his own business. Hal worked for ROWE as a field service technician for a little over a year. Then in 1986 after completing the programming for an automated CTL line for Ford, he and his brother Shale started their own dealership called Juster & Juster.

Shale and Hal worked their way up to becoming one of ROWE's top dealers year after year, servicing customers in the greater Minneapolis / St. Paul area.

When Mestek acquired ROWE in December of 1995, Juster & Juster was one of the few ROWE dealers who stayed on with us and even sold equipment from the CWP and CoilMate/Dickerman product lines.

In 1989 Shale hired their first employee, a service technician named John Schneider who quickly learned their extensive product line and assisted on installations and service calls. Eventually they hired additional service technicians to support their growing customer base.

In addition to selling presses and feed lines they also utilized Hal's gift for programming by providing control upgrades on press lines, cut-to-length & slitting lines. Hal even designed and sold his own press control by repurposing customers' old PCs and providing his own Windows-based program.

As their reputation grew, they began winning installation and control retrofit bids across the United States, in Canada, Mexico, and even a few customers in South America.

In April of 2021 Hal passed away unexpectedly. Shale, who was semi-retired at the time sold the company to their very first employee John Schnieder. Shale continues to make sales calls and quote equipment.
